West 12 - Medical Unit

West 12 is a 24-bed acute care medical unit. Nurses on this unit care for patients of all ages, but many are infants. The unit has an infant and respiratory focus. Some of the main respiratory diagnoses include bronchiolitis, pneumonia, asthma, and croup. Some of the main infectious disease diagnosis include viral respiratory or GI illness, bacteremia, meningitis, or cellulitis. They also see other diagnoses such as dehydration, difficulty feeding, eating disorders, etc.

Medication Administration & Classification	Unit specific- check with resource person prior to administering
Supplies	Supplies in nurse servers, clean utility, med room -
Monitors	Alarm limits on pulse oximeter and cardiac monitor are selected based on age. Select correct profile on monitor.
Other	Use barrier wipes on all infants and other diapered patients
